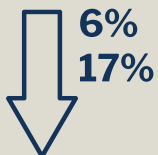


This year's **flu season** by the **numbers**

166.9 million doses of flu vaccine have been **distributed** in the United States as of November 19, 2021.



Flu vaccination rates are **6% lower** for all children this season and **17% lower** for pregnant women

The U.S. is seeing the lowest flu immunization rates since 2016. A recent CDC survey found that among adults 18 and older:

40.9%

have received their flu vaccine

17.6%

plan to receive it

15.1%

aren't sure if they will get it

26.4%

don't plan to get it

80%

This year, influenza activity is low nationally, but has been increasing. Most of the viruses are A(H3N2) and just over **80% of cases** are among children and young adults **aged 5-24 years.**

New Mexico is reporting **high levels** of flu activity while Georgia and Mississippi are reporting moderate levels
